Small group is a great entry point. See the people that are alone and need to be seen. Some events are not easy for the shy. Registered for the parish and they sent me envelopes which was the extent of the welcome to the parish. Teach ourselves to SEE the other.	
Welcome retreat – ambassadors or leaders that can reach out to those who are alone or "outside". Teaching us to look for ways to make others feel welcome. Saying a prayer and asking who we should reach out to today. I come to mass to be present with THE PRESENCE. If I do that, I can be present for others.
